Austin Educational Services Director John Alberts spoke at our February 18th meeting about High Potential programs in Austin Public Schools, as well as the upcoming Hormel Foundation Gifted and Talented Education Symposium to be held in Austin, June 13-17

The stated purposes of Lions Clubs International are:

To Organize, charter and supervise service clubs to be known as Lions clubs.

To Coordinate the activities and standardize the administration of Lions clubs.

To Promote the principles of good government and good citizenship.

To Take an active interest in the civic, cultural, social and moral welfare of the community.

To Unite the clubs in the bonds of friendship, good fellowship and mutual understanding.

To Provide a forum for the open discussion of all matters of public interest; provided, however, that partisan politics and sectarian religion shall not be debated by club members.

To Encourage service-minded people to serve their community without personal financial reward, and to encourage efficiency and promote high ethical standards in commerce, industry, professions, public works and private endeavors.

LCIF spotlight



LCIF is working directly with Lions of Haiti as well as Lions in neighboring countries to assess the immediate needs and also develop a long-term reconstruction plan. Two containers of relief supplies have been transported by Dominican Republic Lions to Haitian Lions and Leos, and supplies were distributed to an orphanage and hospital and the tent cities. Two hundred tents have set up for victims and relief workers to establish three Lions tent cities in Delmas, Blanchard and Carrefour-Feuille. Between the three tent cities, 3,000 total people are being helped.
